English Teacher Degree Requirements

For students admitted prior to September 1, 2006

"Old" Requirements:

Students must complete 18 credits in courses in English as follows: (a) English 700.1X; (b) three courses in three different areas chosen from areas 1-4; (c) one course from area 5; (d) one course from either area 6 or area 7. To complete the degree, students must pass a comprehensive written examination given by the English Department.

1. Literature before 1500: ENG: 705, 706, 708, 791
2. Literature from 1500-1800: ENG: 721, 724, 731, 751, 760, 761, 792
3. Literature from 1800-1900: ENG: 741, 742, 749.1, 749.2, 752, 793
4. Literature from 1900 to the present: ENG: 750, 750.9, 753.1, 753.2, 757, 763, 794
5. Theory and Criticism: ENG: 710, 775, 775.1, 775.2, 775.3, 775.4, 778, 779, 795
6. Language: ENG: 701, 702, 702.6, 703, 705, 706, 795.6
7. Comparative Literature: CMPLT 706.1, 707.1, 708.1 and ENG 795.7

For students admitted after September 1, 2006

Students must complete 18 credits in courses in English as follows: (1) English 700.1X and 715X; (2) three courses in three different areas chosen from areas 1-5 and 7; (3) one of the following courses from area 6: English 701X or 702X or 702.6X or 703X or 795.6X. To complete the degree, students must pass a comprehensive written examination given by the English Department.

2. Literature from 1500-1800: ENG: 721, 724, 731, 751, 760, 761, 792
3. Literature from 1800-1900: ENG: 741, 742, 749.1, 749.2, 752, 793
4. Literature from 1900 to the present: ENG: 750, 750.9, 753.1, 753.2, 757, 763, 794
5. Theory and Criticism: ENG: 710, 775, 775.1, 775.2, 775.3, 775.4, 778, 779, 795
6. Language: ENG: 701, 702, 702.6, 703, 705, 706, 795.6
7. Comparative Literature: CMPLT 706.1, 707.1, 708.1 and ENG 795.7

NOTE: Students who took first courses in the MA English Teaching Program during Fall 2006 semester or earlier, (and maintained continuous matriculation since then) can fulfill either set of requirements. Students who begin first courses in Spring 2007 semester will have to fulfill the new requirements.
